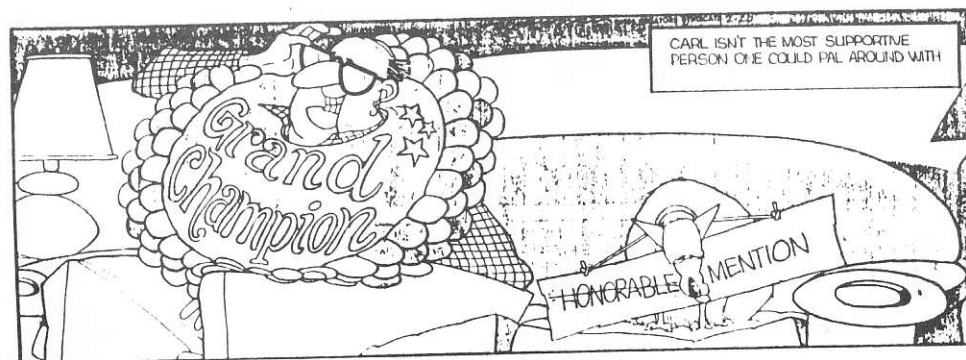

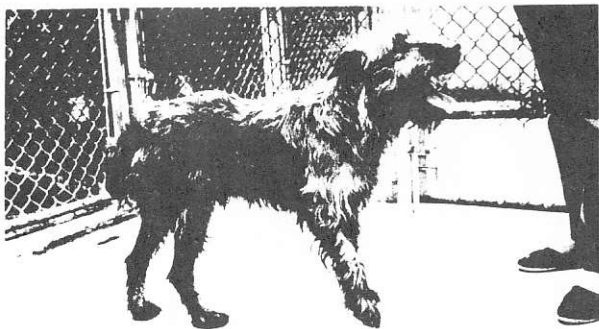

**The following is Dr. David Doane's critique of the Montgomery County show held October 10, 1993:**

Sunday, October 10, 1993, was cold and windy. Early morning attendees were searching for a warm place to sit or stand and something warm to drink. By the time of the Irish Terrier judging the weather had abated somewhat. The spirit and quality of the competition raised the temperature to a pleasant level and made for an interesting and rewarding judging experience.

The ring was of ample size to handle large classes and provide room for the dogs to move. The sportsmanship and camaraderie exhibited in the ring was excellent and added to the pleasure of the event. The overall quality and condition of the dogs was good and the general consistency was impressive. Coats by and large were of excellent quality and reflected not only the results of good breeding but also hours of good care. Temperaments were very sound. There was little shyness and most dogs moved and stood for examination properly; they exhibited trust in their surroundings; alertness; and, true terrier temperament when sparring.


Judging of the dogs progressed in an elimination manner, and the final group had been compared to those remaining in competition several times. The final selection of Best of Breed exhibited excellent terrier characteristics and was typical of an Irish Terrier with a lovely head and elegant neck fitting into well laid back shoulders. His coat was hard, closely fitting and of lovely color; movement was graceful with genuine reach and drive; and excellent presentation made the most of his alert personality. The bitch competition was not quite as strong. I kept coming back to the veteran time and again. In the end she wore down her rivals and was extremely deserving of the honor which, it is understood, she has done before. She was truly in remarkable condition for her age.

The dog classes were particularly good. The winner's dog was well-balanced with all areas in the right proportion. The reserve winner's dog was a youngster with a great potential. The winner's bitch represented a classic Irish Terrier. It was a pleasure to later learn she was the daughter of Best of Breed and granddaughter of best of Opposite.

All in all it is my impression that the breed is in excellent hands. There are some very fine specimens from which to continue development of this lovely animal. I enjoyed the assignment very much and appreciate being asked.

On a personal note, I still miss judging Irish Terriers on the table which brings them up to eye level and creates an added dimension from which to make one's selection.

### CPR CAN SAVE MY LIFE

After our ITCA President had occasion to use this article published in the Irish Terrier Club of Northern California's Newsletter to save an unconscious puppy, she thought it might be a good idea to share the information with the ITCA Newsletter readers. Outback Annie, my Australian Terrier, is Co-Editor of this piece. Annie feels the proper rearing and training of humans, "HU's", is important and she feels it is equally important to share her expertise with her I.T. brothers and sisters. You see Annie thinks she is an Irish Terrier since she has spent more time with the Irish than her own breed.



'Hi kids, it's that Awesome Aussie, Outback Annie, back again to enliven and enlighten your lives. This time it is strictly serious business, so listen up! By this time most of our HU's know how to perform CPR on each other, but how about us? Would your HU know what to do for you in case of emergency? You know how it is with us dogs, particularly Terriers...we can get ourselves into pretty deep doo-doo sometimes with our indiscriminate biting, chewing, and leaping before we leap tendencies. So, sit your HU's down and read this to them and then give them a test. It may save your life some day.

There are two important things they need to know that make HU to dog CPR different from HU to HU. First, HU's are resuscitated on their backs. We dogs need to be placed on our right side so as to compress the heart on the left. Also, where HU's use mouth-to-mouth breathing, for us it is mouth-to-nose while holding our mouths closed. Using these changes, the process is pretty much the same as for HU CPR. Here is the way they should do it:

1. Check us for responsiveness. A dog in shock will have shallow breathing, pale gums, cold paws and lethargy.
2. Check our airway. If there is an obstruction from something swallowed a short Heimlich procedure with chest blows (hey, take it easy) or abdominal thrusts will help us expel the object from our airway.
3. Check for heartbeat. If there is no heartbeat they should begin CPR. Put the heel of the hand on the dog's heart on the left side just behind the elbow and rapidly compress the chest 6 times, allowing 1-2 seconds, then 3 breaths, blowing gently into the nostrils while holding the muzzle closed with your hands. Repeat 10 times. Check for heartbeat and breathing. If there is no heartbeat or respiration, resume CPR. Don't give up on us and keep checking for a heartbeat and respiration.
4. If, or when, there is a heartbeat but no respiration, continue mouth-to-nose respiration. Watch for the rise and fall of the chest with each breath. As long as you feel a heartbeat continue respiration at the rate of 8 to 10 breaths per minute until spontaneous breathing starts.
5. Wrap us in a blanket and keep us warm and get us to the nearest dog doctor, veterinarian to your HU, as fast as possible. Of course, the ideal situation

would be for someone to be driving your HU to the vet while the mouth-to-nose respiration is being given.

Of course, if your HU lives within a quick drive (5 or 6 minutes) of your vet, better they just drive you over there, but since most of us don't live that close to a clinic and since most of us seem to pick evenings and weekends to get into trouble, make sure your HU knows what to do for you in case of emergency. Just as in HU's, the oxygen flow to our brain must be restored as quickly as possible to avoid permanent brain damage. Don't forget, read this to them and then test them to make sure they've got it right. The life you save may be your own!

I would like to thank Jim Cassity for providing these posters.

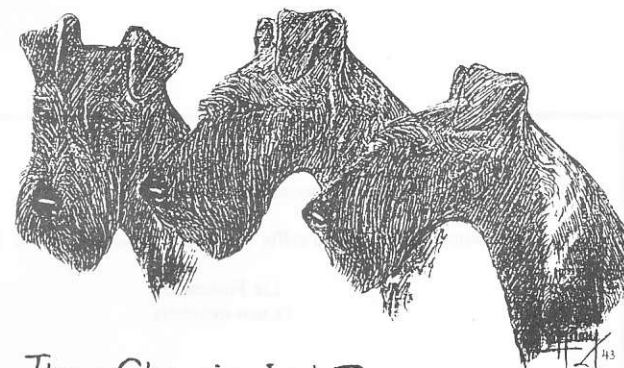

The bitch on the left eyed the slim brunette artist clad in play suit and sandals thinking, "Five seconds more and I'm gonna pounce on that shoe strap and shake it to death." The Irish in the middle, descendant of brave wartime messengers, quietly relishing the prospect of WW II service, raced for a trench when the tea kettle whistled. The third terrier, a born ratter, sure that the fine bristle head of Miss Tiffany's brush was the tail of a mouse, sprang with abandon at the revered artist's brush, upsetting the easel.
