The following figures will show that the increase in the showing of Irish Terriers first noted in 1955 turned down in 1958. This decrease in showing activity was accompanied by a discouraging decrease of about one fifth (20.53%) in registrations during the year to a new low of 418.

(In the following remarks, the figures in parentheses are the comparable figures for the previous year.) During the calendar year, 1958, 98 (112) Irish Terriers made wins that involved trophy points, 49 (72) of these belonged to members of the Irish Terrier Club of America and 49 (40) belonged to non-members.

Seven Irish Terriers completed championships during 1958 (19 in 1957, 20 in 1956, 11 in 1955 and 12 in 1954.) During 1958, two Irish Terriers were awarded Companion Dog obedience degrees, and one qualified in Tracking.
