
SECRETARY'S REPORT

Since the last Newsletter, the Board has acted on two items: 1) The Board has been notified that the name of Alfred Niese, ITCA president from 1948-1949, has been omitted from the list of ITCA presidents engraved on the President's Trophy. The Board voted unanimously to have his named engraved at the proper place on the trophy. 2) Remembering the last annual meeting, the Board voted 15-1 to purchase a gavel for use by the president during his term in office. The gavel will be engraved with his/her name and date of tenure and be awarded to the president at the expiration of the term.

At the last annual meeting the Board voted to propose a change in the Bylaws by eliminating the extra 30-day grace period. This last month ballots were sent to all members in good standing (those whose 1984 dues were paid) and so far a large number of ballots have been returned. The results of the vote will be announced in the next Newsletter.

During the month of April the secretary and treasurer prepare the roster for 1984. If any of you have moved recently, we hope you will notify the secretary of your address and phone number change so that the new roster will be as accurate as possible.

CRUFTS '84 COMMENTARY - by Carol Butterworth of ITCNJ

Although my own interest is in the breed judging, talking with others who also are "owned by Irish Terriers," the agility competitions, the obedience trials, the 200 trade stands with everything imaginable for sale, and the royal special events, the current ITCA probably would want commentary on Group. I should preface my remarks with the fact that I sat with Alf Veale for Group. We ran into each other in the Overseas Lounge at Crufts (a special hospitality area for visitors from all nations) and consequently, I was in stitches throughout Group! For anyone new to terriers, Alf is a terrier man from Cornwall, England, and spent several years showing dogs in Canada, primarily Wires. He trained under Ted Ward. He has shown at Montgomery, Westminster, etc., and speaks of everything from setting ears with candle drippings to how many rats an Irish can fling into the air in an hour! He sends his regards to Doug McClain, Peter Green, etc., and I told him of the banner entry at Montgomery'83 under Nick Calicura.

Crufts had an entry this year (my third time there) of 10,272 dogs, over a period of three days: Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, February 10, 11, and 12. A guesstimate on the number of people each day would be 30,000. Dogs come from everywhere and ride the train bus, underground, and since they are on leashes, they must be carried while on escalators. I well remember an Irish Water Spaniel, Jethrow, who was the first on when the underground door opened and got a seat for his master! He had taken an overnight train down from Scotland. Clear the gangway! Righto, luv!

Group is judged in the Main Collecting Ring at the end of each day. Terriers and Gun Dogs were on Saturday. Judging was Mr. A. O. Grindey for terriers. Sitting with Alf now, I watched the semi-finals of Agility (one of my favorite events -- I'd love to run an Irish in that, especially up and down a seesaw, into the suspended tire, and through the canvas tunnel -- what fun it would have!) just prior to Terrier Group. The very Brrritish commentator introduced each one "in the fiercely competitive world of terriers, each being on tiptoe of expectation, and each desiring to capture the top terrier spot. ." "Get on with it, luv," says Alf! Representing the king of terriers is the #1 Airedale in the country, Ch. Jokyl Gallipants . . . Having considerable vogue in the Antipodes is the Australian Terrier . . . Next is 9 year old (!) Bedlington Ch. Avilas Lucky Lad of Foggyfurze . . . Then the terrier of the Border country . . . Each representative is beautifully portrayed inwords, but among dog men in the audience, one hears: I'll dig up hell if he puts that up. . . The Bull is having a jolly good time playing with his lead in the middle of Crufts, no less. . . Too heavy saddled. . . Super drive but too many bloody whiskers. . . Nice Smooth. . . Young Dandie. . Good chap, that Westie, nice short back, glorious head, look at him go, he loves it, a born showman. All gaited, examined, and lined up now with everybody facing in the same direction, except the Irish! And the judge points to the Westie, Ch. Jaimont of Whitebriar, a 5-year-old champion from Open Dog Class (99 total Westies) for Best in Group. An explosion of applause and then he points to the playful Bull Terrier for Reserve Best in Group. Next is a sudden rush of photographers and press into the ring as the elegant trophies are presented. The Group Trophy is the engraved Send Gold Vase, worth a fortune and originally presented in 1930 by the owner of the Send Great Dane Kennel. Incidentally, the Reserve Best of Gun Dog Group Trophy comes down from noted New Jerseyite Geraldine Rockefeller Dodge (the Giralda Challenge Trophy) of Morris and Essex fame. Montelle Gamblin Millar, a 2-year-old from Post Graduate Dog Class, shown by Ann Bradley in a total entry of 25 Irish, represented the breed in Terrier Group.

Overall, in some terriers this year, I'd say the quality was down, but it's the old story -- a good judge entices a good entry. For example, I was disappointed not to see the famous Ch. Enniskillen Dragoon, handled by Peter Bell and owned by 9-year-old Rory Semple, but he and several distinguished Irish simply were not entered. I felt sorry for my friend Di from Australia who had traveled such a distance to what she dubbed "pet show quality," whereas my flight was just a matter of hours and only \$300, round trip out of New Jersey. I've seen superb entries in previous years; this was just a fluke. Crufts, however, has a zillion other aspects to compensate!

My Finnish friend Helmi got a kick out of the fact that every Irish I ranked first from ringside placed fifth in the judge's opinion! Later a nicely balanced Irish in an ex-pen caught my eye (he wouldn't let any other dog in there!), and I asked his solemn owner how he did in the ring -- "fourth" -- "Oh, then he must be a good one in my opinion!" That certainly generated the common bond that dog shows are the same the world over and it is not always the best specimen that wins! Edna's (Mrs. Howard Jones) newest dog is lovely (another fourth!) and has done some good winning. He showed beautifully, is quite racy, and has a lovely head and coat. Breezy Beau. When I took my annual ride out to visit her in Gloucestshire a few days later, I got to know him better (marvelous temperament) and his gorgeous pups, all of whom thrive in the great outdoors, regardless of the weather.

In short, a Lhasa Apso got Supreme Champion at Crufts '84, Ch. Saxonsprings Hackensack, alias "Hank." He is four years old and sleeps on a couch in his home in Yorkshire. His trophy is bigger than he is! A Pomeranian, Lareva's Shooting Star, got Reserve. And \underline{I} got Tom Horner's grand new book, $\underline{\text{Terriers of the World}}$ (just published, 432 pages, 31 different terriers), plus a ton of other treasures to cart home from lively London!

The Irish Terrier Club of Southern California is alive and well. Thank you. In June we joined the Great Western Terrier Association for their annual "Workshop and Fun Match." Three judges were used. One from our breed, one from another terrier breed, and a third was a professional handler. All Irish were welcome, regardless of age, with puppies judged separately. Each judge graded the entries on a separate sheet for each dog and judged against the standard points (coat and grooming were not taken into consideration). Only winners were announced. The participants received their sheet of judging from each judge after the show. This was not viewed as a "contest" but rather as a "learning tool."

In November we held our annual "owner-handler" show in conjunction with the Cabrillo KC All Breed Show. The handlers have finally accepted the conditions so the roles were reversed with the handlers cheering from the other side of the ropes.

Our business meetings are now held over a seven-foot "grinder" sandwich with slices going for \$2.00 apiece.

"WINTER WARNING!

More harmful than old fashioned rock salt, the new chemical ice solvents for walks and streets mean some extra watchfulness on our part. If you do exercise your dogs in areas other than your own back yard, it is a good idea to make sure that their paws are cleaned when you get them back into the house. Dogs have a tendency to lick their paws after a romp in the snow and ingestion of these chemicals can pose a danger of poisoning! Automobile anti-freeze seems to be irresistible to cats and dogs -- if you have some around the garage or basement or leaking from the car onto the floor of the garage or driveway, be sure your animals don't lick it up; anti-freeze is poisonous. Irish may be hearty, but on those extra-cold days and nights, especially if the dog's coat is short from grooming, give him a sweater or coat if you plan a longer than 10 or 15 minute walk."

PHILADELPHIA IN NOVEMBER!

The Veterinary Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine (VHUP) will offer special tours on Thursday and Friday, November 15 and 16, 1984, to our friends who are in Philadelphia for the AKC's Centennial Celebration.

The Hospital, located on the campus of the University of Pennsylvania, is only minutes from the Philadelphia Civic Center, the site of the AKC's Centennial Dog Show. VHUP, a four-story building, was erected at a cost of \$16.5 million and opened October 19,1981. Staffed by about seventy veterinarians and sixty support personnel, it is organized much like a human hospital, providing patient care, teaching, and research. Special emergency and intensive care areas operate around the clock. The wards can accommodate up to 250 small animal in-patients and there are special isolation wards for infectious diseases. The 21 clinical specialties at VHUP include medicine, soft tissue surgery, orthopedics, dermatology, ophthalmology, neurology, oncology, medical genetics, reproduction, pediatrics, epidemiology, public health, and clinical laboratory medicine.

Tours will begin each day at 1 p.m. and will be conducted at regular intervals until 6 p.m. Admission tickets may be obtained by writing to "Centennial Tours," VHUP, 3850 Spruce St., Philadelphia, PA 19104. The reservation request should indicate the day and time preferred for taking the tour and alternate choices of time. On the tours, visitors will be shown many special features of VHUP and get an understanding of the complex facilities required for patient care, teaching, and research in veterinary medicine.

The University of Pennsylvania's School of Veterinary Medicine celebrates its Centennial Year, along with AKC, in 1984. The Veterinary School has special programs throughout the year, including an exhibit at the University Museum (opening to the public on October 4, 1984) - "Man and Animals - Living, Working, and Changing Together."

Q: Is it all right to use over-the-counter (OTC) human medications on a first-aid basis in dogs and cats? —P.G.

A: OTC medications are formulated for human use, but most can be used safely for dogs and cats on a first-aid basis. It is always best to obtain veterinary advice, if possible, before using OTC drugs in pets, particularly in cats, which are overly sensitive to many drugs. For example, aspirin and Tylenol can be fatal to cats.

Dosage adjustments, based on weight, will need to be made. As a rough guide, the human adult dose can be used in dogs that weigh more than 100 pounds; the children's dose will do for medium-sized dogs, and the infant dose should be used with small dogs and cats, or halved for toy breeds and small cats. An OTC medication for use on the skin (except antiseptics) should not be used on pets because of the danger of poisoning if they lick it off.

Examples of commonly used OTC medications that can be used in pets are:

- Aspirin for pain and fever at a dosage of three-quarters of a grain for every 10 pounds of body weight every 12 hours (NOT to be used for cats).
- Di-Gel, Pepto-Bismol and Mylanta for stomach upsets.
- Kaopectate for diarrhea.
- Milk of magnesia, mineral oil, dioctyl sodium sulfosuccinate or Fleet enema for constipation.
- Antiseptics such as 3% hydrogen peroxide, Betadine, Mercurochrome or Merthiolate for minor wounds.
- Mineral oil for cleaning the ears.
- Murine, Visine or artificial tears for minor eye irritation
- Antibiotic ointments for minor wounds.

Antihistamines, bronchodilators and cough suppressants should be used only when prescribed by a veterinarian. Indiscriminate use of such treatments could mask the symptoms of serious disease. Also, some pets have been known to suffer undesirable side effects from such preparations.
