PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Recently, ITCA member Robert Wynne of New York informed me that several members had received a two-page circular from "The International Irish Terrier Society." The circular invited recipients to:

- ·Become members (no dues);
- *Subscribe (\$8.00 per year) to "The Irish Terrier World" (monthly "when on full schedule");
- ·Purchase classified ads and display ads "in the next issue";
- ·Purchase a listing in the Breeders Directory Listing "in the next issue";
- ·Order a "new book on the Irish Terrier," for which "we are compiling material";
- *Send an article and photographs for use in the book;
- ·Purchase advertising in the book.

The circular carried the name of "L. J. Starr, Director" at a box number in Billings, Montana.

One of the intriguing things about the foregoing is that in 1971 John Best received an almost identical circular, mailed from Eau Claire, Wisconsin, but giving the return address as a P.O. box, Washington D.C. This circular carried the name Gerald Franklin Wright, as "Secretary." Mr. Best subsequently learned that in 1966 Mr. Wright had made similar solicitations under the names of International Basenji Society and International Poodle Society.

Earlier this year, after receiving Bob Wynne's inquiry, I wrote to Mr. Starr asking him to send me a copy of their monthly publication for which I offered to pay. In reply, I received only another copy of the circular.

In other words, this solicitation has been going on for a number of years. I, personally, have not seen, or heard of anyone seeing, any publications of "The International Irish Terrier Society." If any ITCA members have seen, or know of anyone having seen, any such publications, I would appreciate your informing us.

Meanwhile, my advice is to send no money until you have seen the product.

FROM THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS:

The Board of Governors has been busy conducting business by mail since its meeting last October. Following are items on which the Board has taken, or is taking, action.

The Board is currently considering the results of returns from the recent balloting with respect to specialty show judges and the procedure in connection therewith.

A site for the 1980 Traveling Specialty is now under consideration. (The $\underline{1979}$ Traveling Specialty will be held May 28 in conjunction with the Battle Creek, Michigan, show—a three-show weekend. More news on that specialty later in the Newsletter.)

The Associated Terrier Clubs, which produce the Terrier Specialty each year in February in New York, at which we hold our winter specialty, is planning a symposium, aimed at helping judges to better understand the Terrier breeds. The various breed clubs, including the TTCA, are to make presentations. The date has not vet been set. In anticipation, the Board of Governors has selected a committee to prepare background material for the ITCA presentation. Members are Dr. Joseph Sayres, chairman; Marion Honey; Joyce Wilson; John Best and George Kidd. This committee is to prepare a discussion of the various points of the Irish Terrier standard of the breed, much in the manner of John R. Thorndike's booklet "The Irish Terrier Standard Simplified" (which is reproduced in the ITCA 1959 Breed Book.) If you have any questions concerning the Irish Terrier Standard, please communicate with Dr. Sayres.

ITCA member Isabelle O'Connor requested the Board to make a policy statement regarding the occasional practice of some people of "crimping" Irish Terrier ears, by use of a clamp, palpably in violation of AKC regulations. Gregor Hetzel is preparing such a statement for Board action.

Board member Ellis West is writing a pamphlet on Irish Terrier puppies, now in the first draft stage.

The Board voted to invite the ITCA delegate to the AKC to attend meetings of the Board in a non-voting capacity.

In addition to the foregoing, the Board, of course, has been carrying on its routine affairs.

The AKC is considering the possibility of adding an additional class at specialty shows only for dogs over 12 months of age and under 18 months. While pointing out that no specialty club would be required to use this class, the AKC polled breed clubs to find out whether such a class would be used if available. The ITCA Board of Governors voted that it would not use such a class for the following reasons:

- ·We do not need an additional class because the entry size is usually not large.;
- An additional class would dilute the entry in other existing classes;
- Another class would increase our trophy bill.



AKC RELEASES INDIVIDUAL AND LITTER REGISTRATIONS

The AKC has released complete registration statistics for 1978. Individual registrations decreased 3.3%, down to 980,299 from 1,013,650 in 1977. Litters decreased 2.2%. 1978 was the first year since 1969 total individual registrations did not reach one million.

Individual Irish Terrier registrations decreased from 385 to 362 (6%) and the breed's standing from 86th to 95th. Irish Terriers ranked 99th in litter registrations with 68. In 1977 Irish Terriers were up to 86th place with 116 litters registered.
