ANNUAL TROPHY COMPETITION --- 1952 AWARDS.

This month's News Letter includes the results of the Club's 1952 trophy competition and statistical information compiled by Brig. General Edward B. McKinley of Acton Center, Mass. The trophies are awarded on the basis of official A. K. C. records of all licensed shows as published in the American Kennel Gazette. Plaques commemorating the wins have been ordered and will be sent upon completion.

Congratulations to all winners. In presenting the awards General McKinley prepared the following information for the purpose of clarifying the changes governing our Annual Trophies:

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE IRISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA:

The February Irish Terrier News Letter mentioned the fact that at the Annual Meeting of our Club there took place a lengthy discussion of the conditions governing our annual trophies. Mr. Mullins, our President, felt that this discussion revealed that the conditions governing these trophies were not generally understood. He asked that some clarification accompany this announcement of the awards for 1952.

During the discussion one of our members expressed surprise that dogs had to win American-bred classes to earn points toward three of our trophies. Then he admitted that he had never read the conditions governing the trophies which are published in our Breed Book of 1948 starting on page 40.

Therefore, it would seem to be appropriate to start the clarification of the conditions of our annual trophies by recommending that each member read the rather complete coverage of this subject starting on page 40 of our latest green Breed Book (1948).

Of course, since 1948 there have been some changes in these trophies, but the changes, as announced from time to time, have been few and in no way confuse the conditions outlined in the Breed Book.

These are the changes:

- 1. It is not now possible to award the trophies at the Annual Meeting because the American Kennel Club has retarded its schedule of publishing show awards.
- 2. In 1950 when the Bred by Exhibitor Class was introduced into the show classification, Mrs. Marcus Boyd sponsored the annual Marcus Boyd Memorial Trophy to be awarded to the member-owner of the dog winning the Bred by Exhibitor Class the greatest number of times during the calendar year.
- 3. In 1951, at the suggestion of its sponsor, Mrs. Hall, the conditions of the Champion Spokesman Trophy were changed to permit wider competition. Previously only placings in the Terrier Group and Best in Show had counted toward this trophy. The conditions were changed to base the awards only on Best of Breed wins.
- 4. As reported in the February Irish Terrier News Letter, the name of the Champion Spokesman Trophy has been changed to The Alfred M. Niese Memorial Trophy.

5. Also the name of the Wilmot R. Evans Memorial Trophy has been changed to The Edwin A. Sayres Memorial Trophy. The conditions governing this trophy are unchanged and remain as published on page 46 of our Breed Book. This trophy, under its new name, is now sponsored by our friend and official trophy manufacturer, Mr. Charles Thomae of Attleboro, Mass.

SOME STATISTICS ON IRISH TERRIER SHOWING FOR 1952.

As was the case last year, the figures on Irish Terrier showing for 1952 look very much like the year before, giving us three years of relative stability. We haven't seemed to be able to show any appreciable gain in activity, but at least the downward trend of a few years ago has been checked. (In the following remarks, the figures in parentheses are the comparable figures for the previous year.) During the calendar year 1952, 109 (104) Irish Terriers were shown, 57 (54) of these belonged to members of the Irish Terrier Club of America and 52 (50) to non-members. Two of these dogs changed ownership during the show year. Eight (13) Irish Terriers completed their championships during 1952.

IRISH IN GERMANY:

Here are some interesting statistics on Irish Terriers taken from the German publication "Der Terrier". Nine Irish were exhibited at Nineteen shows during 1952. A total of 132 dogs were registered for the year (representing 26 litters) as compared to 82 registrations for 1951 and 115 for 1950. There were 2 Champions recorded. Out of the eleven terrier breeds Irish were 6th in position.

Again we can look forward to this great outdoor classic with all it's color and atmosphere of exhibitors and spectators. Against the background of green lawns there is no better place to show our Irish. It is hoped our members have their dogs ready and that we will have a good entry.
