IRISH TERRIER CLUB OF AMERICA

The intricate procedure relating to seating of delegates at AKC has been finalized and on 9/14/61, we were notified of Mr. Michael Gately's election to represent us.

NOVEMBER 4TH is Foley's deadline for our trophy list for the Feb. 1962 Specialty in New York. Attached for your convenience and PROMPT attention is a form for catalogue advertisements and one for trophy pledges. In response to the latter appeal for funds sent out by the president, it is regretfully reported that only 1/5th of the membership has seen fit to respond so far.

Our big news this issue is the fall Specialty held on Oct. 8th in conjunction with the All Terrier Show of the Montgomery County Kennel Club held on the beautiful estate of Mr. Harrison Frazier, at Gwynedd Valley, Pa. There were 24 entries; 5 absent. Among those lending their moral support at ringside were Helen and John Best from Wisconsin. The exhibitor coming the longest distance was again Rudy Jensen of Chicago, with 2 of his own entries and one of Jerry Keefe's who is from Iowa. Entries were from Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Iowa, Washington, D. C. and Illinois.

It was suggested that next year at this show we have a Veterans Class. The ADTCA had one this year. They were judged before the Specials class and the winner came in to compete for Best of Breed. Everyone seems to like to see the grand old ones and the not-so-old-but-probably-now-less often out. Lets hear from the members on this please.

The ITCC held its second sanctioned match on October 1st at Antioch, Ill. There were 18 entries, some of which came as far as 200 miles to be present. The special awards of this match are listed further in this bulletin.

The Irish Terrier Club of New York held its first Specialty in conjunction with the Westbury Kennel Club show on 10/1/61. Sorry to report that the hard working chairman of this event was not present due to illness. We all send Nancy Parkes our thanks for a grand job done. Of 18 entries 16 were present coming from Mass., New York, New Jersey, Maryland, Washington, D. C. Pennsylvania. At ringside with our local supporters and many Irish enthusiasts were Jerry Keefe from Iowa and Mr. and Mrs. E. H. McCollough of Tulsa, Oklahoma.

From a member in Ohio our attention has been called to the fact that Irish Terrier Breeder advertisers have been receiving inquiries for wholesale purchase of litters. Needless to say, I think we all frown on such activity. Inquiries by prospective purchasers in the east far out number the available Irish Terriers. At this writing, only one member in the east has notified the Secretary of a litter. At the present time the breeding programs seem to be in the middle and far west.

"Giget McGoo" was named best local dog at the Mattoon Kennel Club show last month. The Daily Journal Gazette of Mattoon pictured her with her owner receiving the trophy. This all breed club had 465 dogs-61 different breeds. This publicity helps keep our breed before the public.

The Irish activity in California is certainly on the upswing. Breeders and exhibitors, even though far apart in distance, are managing to contact each other for shows, etc. Three members recently drove 600 miles to exhibit at Reno. There were 8 entries. Any other long distance exhibitors? (Rudy Jensen has already established a reputation for such activity). Maybe some of the east and west could manage to support the Chicago show in April.

Mrs. Schneider of Ohio writes of the death of their trainer of the Cleveland All Breed Training Club who also was their AKC delegate, who had an Irish purchased from Goswyre Kennel and presented to him by this club.
