#### COMMENTS ON THE 1949 TROPHY RESULTS

In presenting the results of the club's annual competitions, so ably compiled by our good member M. D. Earle of St. John, N. B., it is desired to call attention to certain figures in the statistics at the end which might be overlooked. Notice the alarming increase in the number of shows at which there were no Irish Terriers shown. Also notice the decrease in the number of shows at which competition rated three or more points. This seems to indicate rather forcefully that Irish are just not being shown in the numbers entered in previous years. It means that members of this club must make greater efforts to cover more shows and keep our breed before the public.

Because of the smaller numbers of Irish being shown, the possibility of finding no competition at a show is increased. This should enhance the importance of the Wilmot R. Evans Trophy and the new Marcus Boyd Memorial Trophy which was announced in Bulletin No. 36. Both of the trophies are awarded on the basis of the number of wins, regardless of points, and therefore are designed for the member who exhibits and finds, unfortunately, upon arriving at the show that his dog or dogs are without competition. Keep in mind, however, that to compete for the Evans Trophy the dog must be entered in the American-bred class; and to compete for the Boyd Trophy the dog must be entered in the new bred-by-exhibitor class.

In order to have a clearer understanding of how best to enter your dogs to get the maximum credit toward our annual trophies it is suggested that you turn to pages 40 and 41 of our 1948 Breed Book and refresh your memory on the origin and objectives of these trophies, and their development. Don't overlook the conditions of the Boyd Trophy published in our last Bulletin. This new trophy should be highly prized because, for the first time, the exhibitor must also be the breeder. You can only win it with one you have bred yourself, and anyone can buy a winner.

If you looked at page 40 of the Breed Book you noted among the objectives of the annual trophies "Opportunity for competition to be readily available to all members, wherever located." This objective seems to have been fulfilled. The trophies have been won from Massachusetts to California and from Texas to Canada as shown by the location of the winners listed on pages 50-52 of the Breed Book. The awards since 1946 were contained in Bulletins 27 and 33. Indeed, location seems to prove no handicap.
